

Book review: The Wolf Wilder and Rooftoppers

"Katherine Rundell is the best-selling author of *The Wolf Wilder and Rooftoppers*, which won the Waterstones Children's Book Prize and the Blue Peter Book Award and was short-listed for many others. Other books by Rundell include: *One Christmas Wish* and *The Good Thieves* to name a couple.

In the book, the main characters are Feo and her mother, who live in the snowy woods of Russia, in a house full of food and fireplaces. People have wolves as pets in the book and once they have done something wrong, the owners would send them to Feo's mother who is a wolf wilder and Feo is a wolf wilder in training. A wolf wilder is a person who teaches tamed animals to be wild again, to fend for themselves and to fight and to run.

When the corrupt Russian Army threatens her wolves and arrests her mum, Feo is left with no option but to go on the run. With her wolves by her side, she sets off on a daring, exciting and sometimes scary journey through the snow to St Petersburg, pursued by an evil general who's determined to kill Feo's wolves and stop her at all costs.

This book is great! I highly recommend it. It's a great book especially if you're into animals. I would recommend if you're into longer books.
