Learning at home -


As Teachers we appreciate that learning at home isn't what all children want to do, we are not asking for you to spend hours upon hours, however, statics' show that children who spend time on educational apps and read at home are more likely to be working at age related expectations or exceeding them,.

15 minutes seems to be the "magic number" at which students start seeing substantial positive gains in reading achievement; students who read just over a halfhour to an hour per day see the greatest gains of all.
